## Program 7-17-18 Wheeler Suspension Bridge



Twenty two years ago the LaGrande, Baker, and Wallowa County clubs built a suspension bridge at the Boy Scout camp at Wallowa Lake as a memorial to David Jack Wheeler, a U.S. Forest Service employee who was killed in the line of duty in Idaho in 1995. The bridge is currently unusable since a major flood rerouted the river in 2002, and Rick Bombaci of the Wallowa Mountain Hells Canyon trail group is promoting relocating it higher on Scout property to provide access across BC Creek, whose bridge was blown out by the same flood.
