Here we have the open stlye monitored by a “bites per minute” approach set to an Apple watch.



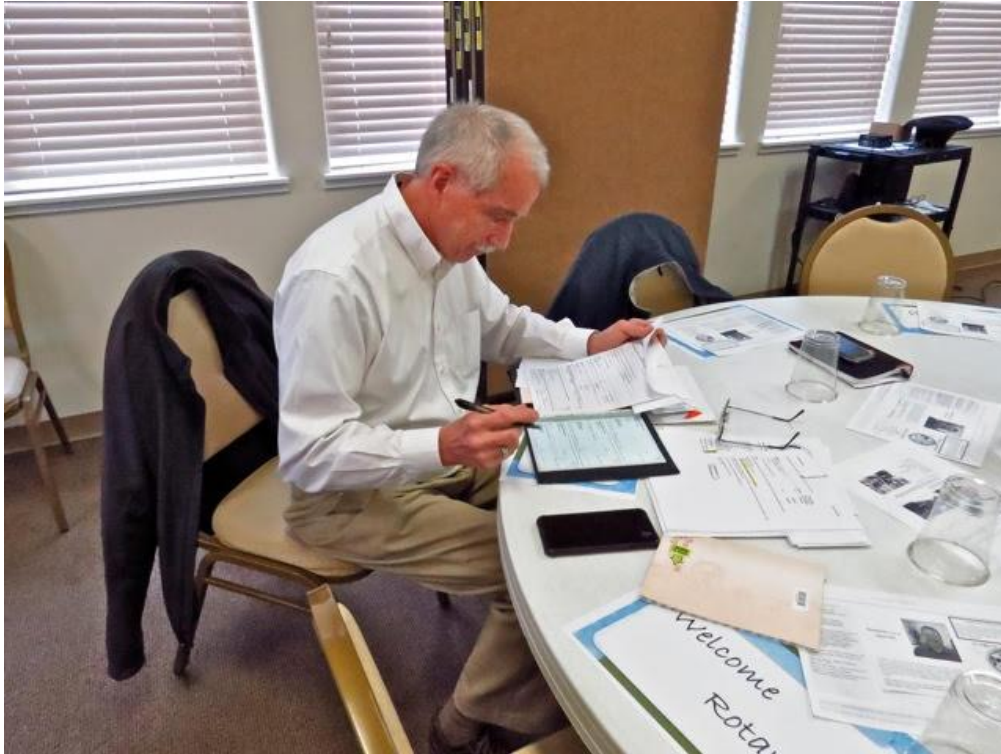
Raised by wolves, this Rotarian learned to eat only with a knife.
